### Learning outcomes

The course is designed for the beginners to start learning spoken Lithuanian. The goal is to master spoken Lithuanian language and gain some reading, listening and speaking skills. By the end of this course, students are expected to be able to communicate in Lithuanian in everyday situations and get acquainted with Lithuanian culture and traditions.

### Description of the subject/course

The course is based on learning Lithuanian language: the basic words and phrases that can help to survive in everyday situations, e.g. in a shop, bus or restaurant, students learn how to ask for way (directions), how to express gratitude, etc. The other aim of the course is to get acquainted with Lithuanian culture, to learn about cultural traditions and customs in Lithuania.
